## 1 Timothy

## Lesson 1 — Doctrinal Fidelity

Chapter 1 strikes a very personal tone. Paul is writing to the preacher he has left behind in a difficult circumstance — and things seem to only be getting more difficult. The work of a preacher can be difficult, frustrating, and full of questions of effectiveness — responding to such, Paul reminds Timothy of what is truly important in his work as an evangelist: instructing people in the truth (1.3) and working to develop godly characteristics in his hearers (1.5). There will be challenges along the way (1.6ff), but not all challenges are insurmountable — look at Paul (1.12ff).
