Lesson 4 — Leadership (3.1-7)

The Holy Spirit's second *trustworthy statement* leads this new section. Like any organization, the local church needs leadership. God's design for the leadership of the local church involves qualified men exercising oversight of the church — men who display both internal and external qualities of godliness. These men are uniquely charged with the "care of the church of God" (3.5).
