


Connection to a burial (Romans 6.3-4) Consider how the Greek word was used in 1st century society:





Near Phaselis, by the sea, there are defiles, through which Alexander led his army... Alexander, meeting with a stormy season, and being a man who in general trusted to luck, set out before the waves had receded; and the result was that all day long his soldiers marched in water submerged to their navels. Now this city too is Lycian, being situated on the borders towards Pamphylia, but it has no part in the common League and is a separate organization to itself."
